Introduction

The overarching goal of the project Data for Inclusive Societies: Foes and Friends of Inclusiveness in Contemporary Greece (DATIS) has been to study the foes and friends of inclusive societies in contemporary Greece by implementing an innovative empirical research design. DATIS has been a data-driven project aiming to explore, both theoretically and empirically, the enemies and the supporters of inclusive societies, focusing on political parties, political elites, and citizens. In a broader perspective, the project aimed at creating an “index of inclusiveness”. At the core of our analysis have been the causes and consequences of adopting hostile attitudes toward other social groups among both political elites and citizens. Furthermore, the project has shed light on interactions between the micro level (citizens, voters) and the meso level (political elites) in shaping these attitudes. To explore this research direction, we examined driving factors that may facilitate or hinder the rise of such attitudes.

This report provides an overview of the project's dissemination and communication strategy, outlining the communication messages developed, the tools and channels employed throughout the project, as well as the planning and evaluation of the dissemination and communication activities. This is the final version of the dissemination and communication strategy.

Website

The DATIS website is one of the main sources of information about the project's actions and is available to all stakeholders (i.e. citizens, scientists and businesses). The website contains both the reports resulting from the analysis of the data from META (Facebook, Instagram) and Greek parties manifestos, while it also acts as a means of promoting the datasets, reports and findings of the project, which includes the data from the questionnaires about the 2024 Elections for the European Parliament, ISSP 2024, ISSP 2025, DATIS pilot and main voter survey, DATIS political elites survey on inclusive societies and DATIS survey experiments. Additionally, the website is linked to the project's BlueSky, Facebook, Instagram and LinkedIn accounts. Finally, there is the possibility for the website visitors to subscribe in order to receive newsletters regarding the activities of the project.

The creation and use of the DATIS website aims to provide information to interested parties about the project's actions such as the promotion of the datasets, reports and findings, as well as articles and presentations by the members of the project's research team. Furthermore, the website describes the project's objectives and expected results, informing visitors from the outset about the project's activities. The project website is available at: <https://datis.gr/> The website was created in the first month of the project (M1) and will remain available for at least 5 years after its end.

The DATIS project logo is included on every page of the website. Also, each page of the website includes a text referring to the funding of the project by the Hellenic Foundation for Research and Innovation (HFRI) under the National Recovery and Resilience Plan "Greece 2.0" funded by the European Union- NextGenerationEU with the relevant logos. The text regarding the financing of the project is as follows: "The project is carried out within the framework of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan Greece 2.0, funded by the European Union - NextGenerationEU (Implementation Body: HFRI)".

Social Media Accounts

Although the project initially stated that social media accounts would be created on Twitter and Facebook to communicate with both the research community and the general public, in practice DATIS developed a broader and more strategic social media presence. Social media platforms form a central pillar of the project's dissemination and communication strategy: due to their widespread use, they allow us to reach a large and diverse audience, including citizens in remote or isolated areas who might otherwise have limited access to information about the project's actions and outputs.

Importantly, by establishing accounts on specific platforms, such as Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, Twitter (X) and later BlueSky, we aimed to increase engagement by tailoring communication to the audiences and interaction styles of each channel, e.g., broader public outreach via Facebook/Instagram, professional and institutional visibility via LinkedIn, and stronger academic networking via BlueSky. Across these platforms, the DATIS team regularly uploads updates on project activities, events, milestones, publications, and other dissemination outputs, encouraging interaction and strengthening the project's visibility.

After the first months of implementation, we decided to discontinue systematic posting on Twitter (X), as certain platform-related limitations reduced our ability to disseminate project content consistently and effectively. To maximize DATIS exposure, especially within the scientific community, we launched a BlueSky account as an alternative channel and concentrated communication efforts there alongside our other active platforms.

Activities such as new articles, participation in conferences, information on the research on inclusive societies, and information on the DATIS Conferences (Joint DATIS Conference and EUPopLink Conference, Panhellenic Conference: Social Research and Inclusive Societies) were promoted through social media. These means contribute to the dissemination of the project's actions both in society and in the scientific community, while existing accounts (e.g. from past and current related projects such as Elnes, DataPopEu, Helpmevote, etc.), groups and pages are used to create a buzz and continuously promote the project and its findings. Although social media does not offer a distinct way of approaching businesses, it can spark the interest of the business sector, especially research firms and those involved in software, data storage and retrieval, to adopt the project's methodology. The project's social media pages use the project's logo as the profile image, while the project's poster with the logo and

key information (such as the full name, budget, beneficiaries, implementing body and context of the action) is used as the cover photo.




Figure 2. DATIS Instagram Account



Papers

As part of DATIS dissemination and communication activities, the research team authored and delivered a set of conference papers that convert central elements of the project into accessible scientific outputs for the broader academic community. These contributions share both empirical results, covering descriptive trends and explanatory evidence, and methodological advances associated with DATIS, including the design and validation of new survey items, the use of pilot studies to improve measurement quality, and the incorporation of ISSP modules into the project's wider analytical framework on political attitudes, social inclusion/exclusion, and contemporary social change. Taken together, the papers raise the project's profile within scholarly networks, promote the diffusion of knowledge beyond the consortium, and produce durable research materials that can be further developed into journal articles, comparative work, and future survey instrumentation.

In addition, the DATIS team has three papers currently under submission for publication in international peer-reviewed scientific journals, further extending the project's reach and ensuring that core findings and methodological contributions are disseminated through high-impact academic outlets.

DATIS Conferences

1) Joint International DATIS Conference (24 Aug 2025) & EUPopLink Conference (25 Aug 2025) — AUTH, KEDEA (Amphitheatre 1)

The Joint DATIS (24 August 2025) and EUPopLink (25 August 2025) conferences, hosted at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (AUTH), KEDEA, Amphitheatre 1, constituted one of the most visible dissemination moments of the project, combining national and European scientific communities in a two-day “research forum” format. The programme included multiple panels, presentation sessions and roundtable discussions, enabling sustained scientific exchange from morning to afternoon, supported by catering (coffee, light meals, refreshments) to ensure continuous engagement. The total participation exceeded 150 attendees, reflecting high interest from both the academic community and broader audiences.

DATIS International Conference (24 Aug 2025). The DATIS day functioned as a structured showcase of DATIS-related empirical work, methodological innovations, and emerging outputs. It opened with the official greeting of the Head of the Department of Political Science and then moved to two thematic presentation blocks, with a coffee break in between. Key presentations covered the positioning of DATIS as a close connect with the implementation of ISSP surveys in Greece, longitudinal research on family and gender-role attitudes, determinants of attitudes toward immigrants, the interaction of digital societies and electoral behaviour, the ELNES2023 election study, and research on congruence between voters and candidates.

In the second panel, the focus expanded to issue-specific and societal themes with clear public relevance, including LGBTQI+ rights through discourse network analysis, femicide, discourse/data practices, the contradiction between feminist “theory and practice,” the 2024 European Parliament elections (electoral behaviour and media), and party positions on European integration.

The conference concluded with an integrative roundtable discussion moderated by Prof. Ioannis Andreadis, Prof. Yannis Stavrakakis, and Dr. Eftichia Teperoglou, who synthesized the main findings and highlighted the broader implications for research on inclusive societies and contemporary political dynamics.

EUPopLink Conference (25 Aug 2025). The second day expanded dissemination to a distinctly European scale through the COST Action CA23102 (EUPopLink) framework, with an all-day programme dedicated to populism and euroscepticism across Europe. The agenda combined (a) presentations by Working Group leaders / Core Group and (b) a structured set of country reports, organized into regional sessions (e.g., Albania–Romania; then Finland, Georgia, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Moldova, Poland; and a final session including Kosovo, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Netherlands, North Macedonia, Slovakia, Serbia, Türkiye, Greece).

This format delivered a comparative “map” of the phenomena, emphasizing how political, social, and historical contexts shape populism and euroscepticism, and culminating in Core Group synthesis remarks outlining next steps.

Media impact (Aug 2025). A major dissemination outcome of the two-day conference series was its wide media coverage, including announcements and post-event reporting by outlets such as in.gr, SKAI, Newsbomb, Theestival, Voria, GRTimes, Politic.gr, Radar.gr, and others, which amplified the reach of the conferences beyond academic audiences and increased public awareness of DATIS-related themes such as inclusiveness, social cohesion, populism, euroscepticism, elite–mass dynamics. The publications are the following:

2) Panhellenic DATIS Conference (16–17 Dec 2025) — AUTH (School of Social & Economic Sciences, Room 212)

The Panhellenic DATIS Conference, held on 16–17 December 2025 at AUTH (School of Social and Economic Sciences, Room 212), was designed as a national flagship dissemination activity that consolidated and communicated DATIS outputs to the Greek research community and the wider public sphere. The two-day structure created a dense programme of panels and discussion segments, again supported by catering (coffee, light meals, refreshments) to facilitate continuous participation. Attendance exceeded 100 participants, underscoring strong national interest and reinforcing DATIS as a reference point for contemporary political and social research in Greece.

The conference opened with greetings by the Head of the Department of Political Science and then proceeded to substantive presentations that connected directly to DATIS' core thematic priorities. Indicatively, the programme included: an “Introduction to DATIS” presentation, work on gender equality and the gap between perceptions and practices, empirical analyses using ISSP 2023 data on national identity, and research on digital interactions and social inclusion linked to a 2027 pilot on social networks. The first day also included work on inclusiveness dimensions in party programmes for the European Elections 2024, and analyses of politicians’ social media posts and their resonance, bridging DATIS research with public-facing questions about political communication and engagement.

The second day further broadened the thematic range with presentations on public-sphere identities, e.g., around the signifier of the “extreme centre”, the political dimensions of family and attitudes toward non-traditional family structures, and evidence on framing effects in shaping attitudes toward immigrants and working women, based on an experimental web survey design. It also incorporated research on the religious dimension in radical-right populist discourse and broader conceptual work on populism’s links to nationalism and nativism.

The conference concluded with a DATIS summary, roundtable and some final remarks, ensuring that findings were translated into integrated conclusions and future research directions including pathways to publications, comparative extensions, and follow-up data collection.

Media impact (Dec 2025). The Panhellenic Conference achieved substantial media uptake, including coverage by AMNA, ERT3, Alfavita, and follow-up reporting on DATIS-related findings, e.g., on politicians’ posts and audience engagement, with additional republication and discussion across outlets such as in.gr and others.
